Boron; Shafter to Frazier Park; Lamont to Ridegecrest; flyaway trash, litter and illegal dumping clutter our roads. The Adopt-A-Road program is our way to fight back and take back the place we call home.

Program Basics:

- ☐ You decide on a group contact/leader.
- You agree to clean it four times per year (more if the area is especially litter-plagued).
- G We feature your group's name on an Adopt-A-Road sign marking your adopted area.
- Kern County Public Works will provide an encroachment permit, safety training, safety vests, trash bags, gloves, post-cleanup trash bag pick-up and disposal. The Adopt-A-Road program project costs you nothing but time and energy.
- You bask in the glory of making a visible difference in the place we all call home.

- Gel free to contact us regarding road availability. Remember: the road you choose to clean up must be in the unincorporated area of the County. Public Works Department staff will be happy to help you select a road to adopt.
- Attend a safety meeting or view the safety video; pick-up your roadside clean-up supplies (gloves, vests and trash bags); select a date and time to conduct the clean-up; contact the Roads Department to register the date, time and location in the master calendar; review the Adopt-A-Road rules and safety tips with your volunteers prior to the event. Clean up and have fun.

The 12 Steps to a Cleaner County!

- 1. Volunteer to clean-up a Kern County Roadway.
- 2. Decide on which road you want to clean-up. You may contact County Roads for help.
- 3. Fill out an application send via fax, email, or U.S. mail.
- 4. Attend Safety Program Orientation or view the Safety video.
- 5. Pick-up clean-up materials including gloves, vests and trash bags.
- 6. Decide when you want to clean-up the roadside.
- 7. Contact the **Public Works** Department **Permitting Division** to register the clean-up date, time and location into the master calendar.
- 8. Review the rules and safety tips with your clean-up volunteers.
- 9. Clean-up your two-mile stretch of roadway.
- 10. Plan to clean-up at least three more times within the year.
- 11. Take pictures and send them into the Adopt-A-Road email, permit@kerncounty.com. You and your group may be featured on the Kern County Public Works social media page!
- 12. Accept our sincere appreciation for a job very well done. You have made a difference!
